Mason was also responsible for managing and remediating data privacy breaches and cybersecurity incidents involving personal data and oversaw DHS's Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) policy, program, and training.

Prior to joining DHS, Mason held a variety of roles at the U.S. Privacy and Civil Liberties Oversight Board (PCLOB), an independent agency with a mission to ensure that efforts to prevent terrorism are balanced with privacy and civil liberties. During her tenure, Mason's roles in the agency included Attorney-Advisor, Counselor to Board Member Ed Felten, and Acting Executive Director. She also served on a detail to the Office of the Director of National Intelligence, Office of the General Counsel, handling Freedom of Information Act and other civil litigation matters.

Mason's extensive legal knowledge extends beyond the public sector. She served as National Security and Privacy Counsel at the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, Rule of Law Counsel at the Constitution Project, and Research Associate at the Yale Law School Lowenstein International Human Rights Clinic, National Litigation Project.
