Michael also built the Intelligence Community Joint Duty Program that was recommended by the 9/11 and WMD Commissions, mandated by the Intelligence Reform Act of 2004, and ultimately recognized by Harvard University as one of the most innovative government programs in America. Michael is routinely sought after to speak and provide counsel on national security matters.
