In addition to his Bloomberg Law commentary, he was a panelist on “Cryptocurrency Fraud and Insolvency in Chapter 11” at the American Bankruptcy Institute’s Winter Leadership Conference in 2025 and co-hosted the ABI TechBytes Podcast on cryptocurrency and the law. He has been quoted in U.S. News & World Report on FDIC depositor protections following bank failures and has authored articles for BankBeat and Connections Magazine on topics including the Supreme Court’s ruling in *Cantero v. Bank of America* and TCPA developments involving AI-generated calls.

He serves as President of the Putnam County Board of Zoning Appeals and has volunteered extensively with Legal Aid of West Virginia, for which he received the 2017 Distinguished Pro Bono Service Award.
