Sam is a leading Kentucky attorney in insurance bad faith and coverage. He has played a lead role in major insurance disputes at both the trial and appellate levels, including first and third party insurance bad faith, coverage declaratory judgment actions, breach of contract/first party actions, and interpleaders. As a coverage and bad faith attorney, Sam has also authored articles in national publications for organizations including the Defense Research Institute, the American Bar Association’s Tort and Insurance Practice Section, the Insurance Risk Management Institute, the Kentucky Bar Association, and many others.

In addition to coverage and bad faith, Sam maintains an active practice that includes media defense, intellectual property, open records, contract actions, commercial litigation, and franchise disputes. Sam has argued in front of the state and federal trial and appellate courts, and he authored a brief in a pro bono asylum case that resulted in new precedent from the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals, finding for the first time that single mothers were a protected class in asylum law.

Sam is heavily involved in public service with the state and local legal community. In addition to serving as President of the Louisville Bar Association, Sam is a Board Member for the Bluegrass Center for Autism, a Board Member of the Louisville Bar Foundation, and an Editorial Board Member for the Kentucky Bar Association’s Bench & Bar.
