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Frost Brown Todd Continues to Grow in Dallas

February 20, 2019 (Dallas, TX) – Frost Brown Todd’s expansion in Dallas continued this week with the addition of five lawyers from the law firm Rose Walker. The group is led by preeminent Dallas-based trial lawyer Martin Rose, who co-founded Rose Walker in 1999 and grew it into a formidable firm of national trial attorneys. Harlow brings a diverse trial practice developed over a career that began at Baker Botts and included several years at litigation boutiques Lynn Tillotson Pinker & Cox and Cowles and Thompson.
