During the USCC hearing, panelists representing some of the world's leading universities, law firms, and think tanks provided testimony on how the Chinese Communist Party views the rule of law and its ambitions to promote those views internationally, the consequences for international law, as well as the challenges posed to the U.S. court system in interpreting Chinese law and recognizing Chinese judgments.

The USCC is a bipartisan commission created by Congress to monitor and report on trade, economic, and defense issues impacting the U.S.–China relationship.
